#### **New Reports**

As of this year, the Department of Education & Training are asking schools to move from a uniformed and mandated report format to one that fits their school community, students, staff and needs.

We are slowly working on this process with the Leadership Team researching various report formats and layouts, talking to staff and then later in the year, surveying and working with you – the Community.

In the meantime, our reports will have only a few modifications with a new report format coming in Semester 2; which will include consultation with you. One modification that we have made already is the removal of the A-E rating. Use of the A-E scale has been criticised by many parents, students, teachers and schools, as where a "C" represents a "Consolidating", "Satisfactory" or "Expected" level of achievement, this "C" scale does not actually recognise students working at a high level and certainly does not reflect the progress a student has made when many students receive the same A-E scale year after year after year. Most schools have removed the A-E rating from their report as we have.

We still have individual student achievement shown through a graphic representation related to an age expected level, individual comments, student behaviour and effort in class and absences.

We look forward to working with you on our decisionmaking about reporting student achievement at our school level rather than at a system level for all schools and then providing you with a report that will reflect our teaching and learning programs at Elwood Primary.

We will ensure that our reports continue to be clear, individualised and provide accurate information on your child's learning progress related to the Victorian Curriculum.

#### **Garden Development**

The completion of the school front garden development will commence in mid June and culminate with the redevelopment of our school carpark. This development will further create an engaging and beautiful aspect of our school. Funds for this project will come from our 2017 market funds.




