Health Alert - Chicken Pox

There has been a confirmed case CHICKEN POX reported in Grade 4. Chicken Pox is a highly contagious but generally mild disease. It presents with a low-grade fever, malaise and a rash. The incubation period is from two to three weeks and is usually 14-16 days. The rash develops into a sore which blisters and progresses to crusted lesions and scabs over about five days. They are most numerous on the trunk and less so on the face, scalp, limbs and mouth.

Apps to look out for

Over the year, we would like to bring to your attention some of the apps and internet sights that students at EPS are sometimes accessing - some are age appropriate for students in primary school and we may recommend them for use, others may have an older intended audience and have risk factors that we would like to draw your attention to.

The first is a music sharing platform - Musically. Although it can be an enjoyable app, we would like to draw your attention to it as there have been child safety concerns and incidents involving students of primary school age. Please see the info sheet attached to the newsletter for more information.

YouTube kids is the 'younger brother' of YouTube - a video sharing platform. YouTube Kids uses an algorithm to select videos that are more suitable for kids - but nothing is ever perfect. There is an information sheet for this app attached also.

All information has been taken from the Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner and more information can be found at http://esafety.gov.au/. Here you will find a lot of relevant and useful information for parents and also many useful services

such as a Cyberbullying Complaints and Reporting service, as well as a service that investigates offensive and illegal content.



Musical.ly

Musical.ly is a social media platform for creating, sharing and discovering short music videos. The app allows you to record and edit a 15 second music clip and share it with other users.



Important information to be aware about when using Music.ly includes:

- Users are able to hide their real age/info so people contacting you may not be the age/gender they say they are
- This can lead to content/communication not being appropriate for the person receiving it
- Users (aka Musers) can search for other users near their own location/city
- Muser-generated videos can be viewed and shared on other social media and messaging apps...this means you may lose control of who sees your video
- · Musers can comment on other muser's videos

Who can access it?

Musical.ly is intended for people over the age of 13, based on the following content warning:

- Infrequent/mild profanity or crude humour
- Infrequent/mild sexual content and nudity
- Infrequent/mild mature/suggestive themes
- Infrequent/mild cartoon or fantasy violence
- · Infrequent/mild alcohol, tobacco, or drug use or references
- Ability for people to contact, hide identities and send inappropriate content

How can I protect my information?

Lock down your account!

The best way to ensure your information is protected is to make sure your security settings are enabled. Go to the 'Settings' tab and click on 'hide location'. This means that another user close by cannot search for you, and you aren't identifying your location via GPS.

When creating a video, be vigilant about the information you share—for example, wearing your school uniform will indicate what school you attend. To block a user/"fan", go to their profile, press on the "..." in the upper right corner, and select "block this user." You can unblock a user on the same menu.

How can I report cyberbullying or abuse?

To report abuse, click on the three dots (bottom right) of the music clip and select "report abuse".



You will then be asked to select a reason.



YouTube Kids

YouTube is a user-generated video sharing platform which allows people to discover, watch and share videos.



YouTube Kids uses filters powered by algorithms to select videos from YouTube suitable for children. However, no

algorithm is perfect. This means your child might still find content you don't want him or her to watch.

Parental controls in YouTube Kids include:

- setting a timer to limit how much time a child spends on the app
- turning off search
- clearing history
- pausing history

Homescreen age level

When you first open the YouTube Kids app, you'll be asked to choose the appropriate age level of videos for your child to view:

- Preschool
- School age
- All kids

After you make a selection, the YouTube Kids initial homescreen will show videos that may interest children in that age range.

Update your age level settings at any time:

- Tap the lock icon in the bottom corner of any page in the app.
- Read and enter the numbers that appear or enter your custom passcode.
- Select Settings.
- 4. Tap Homescreen Age Level (on Android) or Content Age (on iOS).

Parental controls and settings

You can access parental controls and other settings at any time by following these steps:

- Tap the lock icon in the bottom corner of any page in the app.
- Read and enter the numbers that appear or enter your <u>custom passcode</u>.
- Select Settings.

How can I report cyberbullying or abuse?

If you encounter any inappropriate content, flag the video for review:

- 1. Go to the video you'd like to report
- 2. Tap the menu icon in the upper corner of the video player
- Select Report
- Select Yes

Flagged videos are reviewed 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and will be removed from the YouTube Kids app if necessary.
