plus gift vouchers and a winner's booklet.

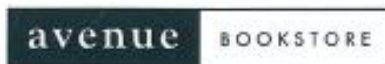
Open to all Victorians with the exception of PPCFR Committee Members and their families.

Entry fee: \$10.00 for adults; students free. Payable by cheque or money order, made out to Port Phillip Citizens for Reconciliation, P.O. Box 1446, St Kilda South 3182, or deposited into the PPCFR's bank account; BSB 633 000; 135 518 546, with deposit receipt or reference attached.

Adult prose entries maximum length 1,500 words, poetry 50 lines; secondary school student maximum length 500 words, poetry thirty lines; primary school student maximum length 250 words, poetry 15 lines.

The author's name must **not** appear on the manuscript. PPCFR Committee members and their families are not eligible to enter.

Include story title and page number on each page. Word processed entries in Times New Roman 12pt, single spaced preferred. Stories that have won competitions published or are under consideration elsewhere, are not eligible. The judges' decisions are final. No manuscripts will be returned.

Prizes to be awarded include:

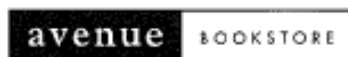
Adults – 1st prize \$500, 2nd prize \$300, 3rd prize \$200.
