#### **Parent Opinion Survey**

Thank you to the over 100 parents who completed the Parent Opinion survey in Term 3. The results of the survey were overwhelmingly positive affirming the hard work that is occurring in all aspects of our school.

The survey is reported back to us in the form of positive responses, neutral responses and negative responses. Some highlights of the survey were positive ratings in the following areas:

- Effective teaching 87%
- Stimulating Learning 85%
- High Expectations for success 86%
- Confidence and resiliency skills 91%
- Promoting positive behavior 96%
- School connectedness 95%
- Parent participation and involvement 96%
- Physical environment 96%
- General satisfaction 93%

There were 20 areas surveyed with all areas receiving a positive response rate of at least 80% with the majority of the remaining percentages being in the neutral category.



We get to try lots of new things that we may not have known about otherwise. Sometimes the parents actually share a bit about what they like to do and what they are interested in which is really fun. Zadie.


I love having parents in for Investigations because they help us solve problems. Oscar.

- shows students how to take advantage of their natural skills


